
#### MULTILINGUAL LIGHT MUSIC COMPETITION




#### **ONAM CELEBRATION**

#### **BUILD A CAREER**



#### SESSION ON MONETARY POLICY AND ECONOMIC STABILISATION



#### ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AND SOCIETAL AWARENESS (EPSA)



#### **EXHIBITION-- EXCITING WORLD OF ECONOMICS**


