


8. REPORT OF MOTIVATIONAL VISIT

WWS is a Government Initiative in order to motivate the toppers towards their higher goals. As a part of the programme, there was the option for the motivational camp and visit, funded by the Government. We submitted a proposal and got a permission letter from the Office of New Initiatives to continue with the procedures for the Camp.

Thus, the WWS coordinator of the College, Dr Sr. Smitha Rose C G, arranged a two day Motivational Camp (Jan 2- 3, 2019) at CHRIST (Deemed to be University), Bengaluru and one day Visit (Jan 4, 2019) to IISC, Bengaluru for the 30 of the II year WWS scholars who are included in the scheme. We went to Bangalore in a hired bus and stayed at CHRIST University for two days. At the very outset of the journey, at 8.00 pm on New Year Day, our Principal, Dr Sr. Magie Jose gave the student a small orientation to make use of opportunities of the Camp, in a fruitful manner. After a small prayer session at the grotto of Our Lady, we started the journey by 9.30 pm. In the bus, scholars were asked to introduce themselves as an ice-breaking session.

We reached Bangalore by 7.30 am on Jan 2, 2019. The accommodation was arranged in the dormitories of the University. The camp was planned in the Campus

in association with Centre for Education Beyond Curriculum (CEDBEC), CHRIST University. The Director of CEDBEC, Dr Kennedy Andrews and staff in charge for our cause Christeena, gave an introduction about the University, its vision and mission and the motto "Excellence and Service". They welcomed us to the college and to its magnificent campus.



Campus Tour

They had arranged different classes, campus tour and interaction with staff and students for our scholars. The camp was started with a Campus Tour of two hours through the premises of the University.



The students could visit mainly two libraries, the studio, the waste recycling centre, and a short talk with the VC, Dr Thomas C Mathew.



Motivational Talks

The students had sessions for Ethical Leadership, Research and Career Guidance. The first session was held by Prof. Ghadially Zohler, Former Associate Dean, Institute of Management, Christ (Deemed to be University), Bangalore. The session was about the topic 'Ethical Leadership in a Globally Dynamic World'. Another talk on Leadership Skills was taken by Prof. Samuel S George, Manager of Leadership Chair, Christ University, Bangalore. Next, they had a session about Emotional Maturity by Ms Rashi Rutherkumar (Kadabur Facilitator)





The second Day sessions include the session about career planning. The student coordinators of CAPS (Centre for Academic and Professional Supports, Christ University, Bangalore) explained about the importance of career planning. The career planning session was conducted by Ms Namratha & Ms Lizil. They have distributed a set of 100 questions to be answered by us. It was helpful for analysing the personality of each of them. The aptitude test helps in identifying everyone's personal interests and capabilities. The next session was on Research and Modern Technologies. The session was guided under the excellent guidance of Dr Namitha & Dr Rinju George. Their main theme was about research using modern technologies on going through the session we got familiar to many and many modern software and

technologies that help our studies. We got information about data collection techniques and different reference styles.



The students had interaction with the Vice Chancellor, faculty and students of respective departments on the afternoon of the second day. They also visited different laboratories on the campus.

Visit: Visweshwarayya Museum

The Coordinator took the scholars to Vishweshwarayya Museum on Jan 2, 2019. It was really a scientific experience for them. We spent around 3 hours (3.00 pm to 6. pm) there.

Visit: IISC, Bengaluru

We got entry permission to IISC, Bangalore through Prof. M R N Moorthy, Department of Molecular Biophysics. We reached there on Jan 4, 2019, at 10.00 am. IISC is an institute for study and research in the field of science. It was established in 1909 by Jamsetji Tata & H.H Sir Krishna Raja Woodeyar IV the Maharaja of Mysore. It was granted as deemed University in 1988. The IISC campus was exotic and with indigenous plant species with about no species of woody plants. The roads on campus are named after the dominant avenue tree. We had a campus tour for two hours but got permission only to enter inside biochemistry department. There they took us to three huge labs with lots of costly instruments. Different kinds of instruments related to DNA study, such as PCR, Gel electrophoresis, microscopes, shaking incubator. Etc.




Afternoon 3.00 pm, we had an interaction session with faculty Prof. M R N Moorthy one of the IISC notable alumni was a professor of molecular biophysics and by Miss Savithri, professor of biochemistry. He shared us a brief idea about the fellowship, entrance exams and also his views in the social evil practices. We are free to talk to him. He advised us that it is not necessary to attain our goal at first attempt. We should keep trying until we reach our goal. He also shared about the lack of women lecturers or professors. We should try to overcome such situations by breaking the shackles of exclusion.

We returned back home that night by 10.00.pm after some shopping.
