ADMISSION RULES

Eligibility of Admission

- All candidates seeking admission to the UG programmes irrespective of the Quota (General Merit/Reservation/Sports/Persons with Disabilities/Community/Management/Inmates of Juvenile Justice Home/Kashmir Students/Students from Andaman & Nicobar Islands) /Trans-gender quota should compulsorily register through Centralized Admission Process (CAP).
- The candidates who have not registered through CAP will not be permitted to take admission to any category of seats at any stage of the admission process.
- The ethnic natives of Lakshadweep seeking admissions need not register through CAP. The colleges shall admit them and thereafter generate CAP ID from the college to which he/she seeks admission itself.
- Candidates should go through the prospectus for Centralised Admission Process available in the University website carefully before entering the registration page.

Community Quota

- *The candidates seeking admission to the community quota should specify whether they are intending so while submitting the personal details and should also opt the colleges at the time of online registration.
 - The seats for community quota are filled upon merit basis from among the students of the community.
 - The University will forward the list of the applied students to the colleges on the date published in the schedule for admission.
 - The colleges will prepare and publish a rank list of the candidates reporting on the date earmarked for admission to community quota. The colleges will also publish the community rank list in the notice board.
- *The colleges will admit the candidates, based on their merit from this rank list as per the schedule published by the University.

Management Quota (Aided and Un aided Colleges)

The seats for management quota in Aided and Self Financing programmes/ courses in Aided colleges are filled by the Colleges.

- *Candidates seeking admission to the Management Quota in Aided/Unaided colleges should register in CAP.
- *Candidates should submit the application final print out at the college at the time of admission.

The candidates without University admission registration are not eligible for admissions to management seats.

*In addition to this the candidates should contact the college and submit separate Management quota applications to apply for management quota seats.

Mandatory Reservation

1. Claims for Mandatory Reservations must be made by the candidate in the relevant column of the online application in CAP. However, the supporting documents shall be submitted at the time of admission in the colleges concerned.
2. Claim for Communal reservation under ‘Socially and Educationally Backward Classes’(SEBC) Reservation of seats to the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes will be in accordance with the provisions contained in G.O.(P)208/66/Edn. Dated 02.05.1966, as amended from time to time.

Reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Quota

Candidates claiming reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Quota should obtain caste/community certificate from the Tahsildars. The seats un-availed by the SC candidates will go to ST candidates and vice versa according to instructions from university.

All admissions will be provisional subject to the verification of certificates and the approval of the University of Calicut.

- ✚ The selected candidate and her parent are to sign a declaration of compliance with rules and code of conduct stipulated by the college before payment of fees.
- ✚ Students and parents should sign a declaration to curb and menace of ragging in the institution.

ADMISSION PROCEDURES

All the candidates who get allotment should report for admission as per the date earmarked in the schedule at the college after remitting the University mandatory fee.

The candidates should produce the following documents in original before the Principal/Head of the college/Institution at the time of admission for verification.

1. Admit Card (Only for students received allotment)
2. The print outs of the application
3. Receipt/Challan of the fee remitted for acceptance of allotment. (University mandatory fee and registration fee).
4. Age proof
5. Qualifying Certificate.
6. Mark List(s) of the qualifying examination.
7. Transfer Certificate received from the Institution last studied.
8. Conduct Certificate
9. S.S.L.C
10. Those candidates who have passed examinations other than HSE/VHSE except CBSE/CISCE should produce Equivalency/Recognition Certificate.
11. Non Creamy layer Certificate / Nativity Certificate /Community Certificate/EWS Certificate as directed by the admitting authorities
12. Candidates who claim bonus/weightage marks shall produce relevant certificates. Community to which the candidate belongs.
13. **Candidates coming for admission should bring 2 copies of passport size photo and retain sufficient number of attested copies of mark list and other documents to ensure proper processing of admission procedures**

For weightage of marks: Original certificates should be produced at the time of interview eg.

- NCC
- NSS
- State Arts Festival
- Illiteracy Eradication

14. **Certificates concerning widows and children of Jawans and Ex-Servicemen and Border Security Force Personnel Killed or disabled in an action.**

For reservation: Attach copies of the following

- Physical Disability
- Sports/Games
- Certificates belonging to SC/ST/OEC/OBC should produce their community certificate

For equivalency Certificate: Candidates from other State/University should produce equivalency certificate from the University
