
Lecture On Posner's Technologial Gap and Product Cycle Theory


Alumnae Talks by Department of Biotechnology


Alumni Interaction Session by Department of History


Talk by Sri Abdul Kareem

Participation in Marian Monsoon Fest during 22.08.2023 - 23.08.2023



19 inmates actively participated in the tailoring class and an exhibition of the stitched items were arranged on 29.11.2023.




Alumni session by Department of Biotechnology on Curricula based volunteering and experiential activity- 20.10.2023

A Humanitarian Doctor to be remembered

When my family and I reached Thrissur forty-nine years ago, after a long stay in Singapore, we found out that although there were doctors to be approached for treatment of our ailments, most of them were MBBS holders and not specialists in certain fields of medicine as nowadays most doctors are. But those doctors were well experienced in all fields of medicine because they had no other choice except to study and observe their patients to ensure their remedy and survival from the diverse maladies during those times. Further studies in India was a tough proposition for doctors then, as that would mean going abroad or to the few medical universities that provided such facilities. Most of the doctors started their practice soon after their graduation and their houseman ship.

Among them all, I felt that Dr Abdulla was one of the best. He died recently on 6/10/2021, after some years of being bedridden, at the ripe age of ninety-eight or so. He was a good and kind doctor endowed with love and affection for all his patients and treated them alike despite the difference in their financial status. I have never seen any arrogance in his attitude to his patients. He would patiently explain to them the methods used and the medicines to be taken to cure their illnesses. His medical fee had only risen to Rupees Fifty at his final stage of practice some years ago while other doctors charged exorbitant fees of a hundred rupees to a thousand rupees. According to the rise in medical qualifications, Dr Abdulla remained simple and humble to the very end of his medical practice.

Life in Thrissur was not easy for our family as we became prone to all kinds of diseases with our entry there. First, we were beset by a skin fungal condition and ringworm disease which caused intense itching all over our bodies. The first doctor recommended to us, could not help us at all. Finally, it was Dr Abdulla who saved us with his skin ointment and some tablets. Within five days the whole lot of us were completely cured of the affliction. It was after that, we realized that he had much practice in Dermatology of civil hospitals of Kerala. Although he did not specialize, he was a worthy doctor on all skin diseases. People from all over Kerala came to him as a last resort in the treatment of chronic skin diseases. My younger brother Pradeep was cured of an explosion of black warts on all his fingers by him through the administration of homeopathic medicine and ointment. He did not despise homeopathy as most allopathy doctors do. He only tried to cure skin ailments in the most effective method possible.

From 1972 onwards, our whole family were Dr Abdulla's patients. My father had returned to Singapore three months after he had settled us in a small rented house on Korapath Lane in the middle of Thrissur. He only returned permanently to us after his retirement in November 1978. Dr Abdulla and his family lived in a large rented house on a road parallel to our lane known by the name Valikkat Road. The houses were the property of a family who owned most of the houses on both roads and either rented or sold them as they saw fit. It was a wonderful area from which we could walk to all the shops and pass through the whole Thekkinkad round of Thrissur town. Also, Dr Abdulla served as the physician for most of the families residing there. He did not mind visiting his patients at their homes if they were too weak to visit his clinic at his residence. He knew the names of all his patients and their families. All of us loved him too. A warm relationship was shared by him with most of his patients and their families.

His daughter Haseena too was a great companion and friend along with Indira and Raji when we studied for the two years of Pre- degree at St Mary's College. I remember playing badminton with them in a court the doctor had built in his compound. He used to watch us whenever he was free. But that was not frequent as he had a lot of patients at home besides his service at the Thrissur Civil Hospital. He had three other children Zahir, Yasmin and Yusuf too. His wife was a well dressed and stylish woman with who he used to go out to places that she wanted to visit. He really made time for his children, enjoying his time with them.

Two years later, our family moved to a house purchased, situated on Divan Narayana Menon Road close to the Regional Theatre and the Indoor Stadium. Still, whenever any one of us fell ill, we used to visit the doctor who kindly welcomed us warmly and treated us. All of us believed implicitly in his treatment. He also refused to take his fees from us although we tried to persuade him. It was in a special way that he treated his patients as friends. My little sister Pameela was completely cured of a bout of filiarisis by his treatment. She was prone to get sick at the drop of a hat but cured effectively by the doctor. Once, the whole lot of us were affected by a influenza virus so we could only lie prone on our beds. Dr Abdulla visited us at home. Soon, we were on our feet, feeling fresh and energetic again. I remember him injecting me with the fourteen doses of rabies vaccine for a dog bite patiently and sympathetically each evening for a fortnight in that terrible period of fear and panic.

I was studying at the Government Engineering College so my bonds with Haseena, Indira and Raji were lessened as they were studying at the Vimala College. By 1980 or so, Dr Abdulla had built a house of his own at Patturaikal as he had retired. Now his outpatient treatment lasted the whole day. Despite the presence of more qualified doctors in Thrissur, he was considered as an authority on skin diseases while capable of diagnosing most other illnesses. Haseena had settled in USA with her husband who is a doctor and two children. I myself had completed my Engineering studies and had married Sasikumar, a faculty member of our Engineering college. I too had procured a job there too. Then the hurryburry of our careers and family life prevented me from contacting the doctor. Yet, at sudden times of illness, we used to visit him. I remember two times when Sasikumar had to be treated by him. The first being for his urine crystallising due to lack of water replenishment during the hot summer as the amount of water intake was insufficient. The second time was the diagnosis of increase in cholesterol level so he was advised to eat less red meat like beef and mutton. From that time onwards, all of us stopped eating such meat. Even my parents-in-law were taken to him by Sasikumar for treatment of any illness. He was best in the treatment of skin problems. But still, he was no less effective in treating other illnesses. The problem we faced was that he refused any fees from us. Even Sasikumar's cousin Ramakrishnan and his family were not charged for treatment of food poisoning due to Sasikumar taking them to see Dr Abdulla as we could not think of any alternative at that time. Treatment for eyesore in 1986 which affected everyone in Sasikumar's family house was done by the doctor very effectively too. He was a master of all trades in the field of

medicine. The affection he showered us with too, built up everyone's morale to resist our illnesses. Due to the fees refusal problem, we became a little reluctant to visit him as the years went by.

By then, there were specialists for all fields of medicine in Thrissur. The situation of seeing only one doctor for all illnesses lessened. Each person started visiting specialists in the various fields of medicine. Many of us missed his caring warm attitude. But with so many personal woes that poor Dr Abdulla had to face then, as the death of his wife and younger daughter in a gruesome car accident in Dubai, his patients tried not to bother him. Haseena, her two brothers and their spouses were present with him to share in his grief. A year later, he started his practice of treating skin ailments once again. He had lost all interest in collecting fees but only strived to his work to gain some comfort and consolation. Sasikumar and I had moved to our new house at Ramavarmapuram so the chances of seeing him became rare. My parents and siblings used to visit him now and then.

Some years later, my parents died of lingering illnesses, a situation in which my siblings and I were fully involved for some years. I heard then that Dr Abdulla had become bedridden. It was a sad situation for a jolly loving doctor to face in the last few years of his life. Now, finally he has gone to his eternal resting abode. I feel relieved that God had given him solace from all the sufferings he had endured in his last days despite offering effective cure for the ailments of his patients. I pray and hope that he rests in peace.
