Introduction

In pursuance of its Action Plan for performance evaluation, assessment and accreditation and quality up-gradation of institutions of higher education, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore proposes that every accredited institution should establish an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a post-accreditation quality sustenance measure. Since quality enhancement is a continuous process, the IQAC will become a part of the institution's system and work towards realisation of the goals of quality enhancement and sustenance. The prime task of the IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the overall performance of institutions. For this, during the post-accreditation period, it will channelize all efforts and measures of the institution towards promoting its holistic academic excellence.

The guidelines provided in the following pages will guide and facilitate the institution in the creation and operation of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). The work of the IQAC is the first step towards internalization and institutionalization of quality enhancement initiatives. Its success depends upon the sense of belongingness and participation it can inculcate in all the constituents of the institution. It will not be yet another hierarchical structure or a record-keeping exercise in the institution. It will be a facilitative and participative voluntary system/unit/organ of the institution. It has the potential to become a vehicle for ushering in quality enhancement by working out planned interventionist strategies to remove deficiencies and enhance quality like the "Quality Circles" in industries.

Objective

The primary aim of IQAC is

- To develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic action to improve the academic and administrative performance of the institution.
- To promote measures for institutional functioning towards quality enhancement through internalization of quality culture and institutionalization of best practices.

Strategies

IQAC shall evolve mechanisms and procedures for

- a) Ensuring timely, efficient and progressive performance of academic, administrative and financial tasks;
- b) The relevance and quality of academic and research programmes;
- c) Equitable access to and affordability of academic programmes for various sections of society;
- d) Optimization and integration of modern methods of teaching and learning;
- e) The credibility of evaluation procedures;
- f) Ensuring the adequacy, maintenance and proper allocation of support structure and services;
- g) Sharing of research findings and networking with other institutions in India and abroad.

Functions

Some of the functions expected of the IQAC are:

- a) Development and application of quality benchmarks/parameters for various academic and administrative activities of the institution;
- b) Facilitating the creation of a learner-centric environment conducive to quality education and faculty maturation to adopt the required knowledge and technology for participatory teaching and learning process;
- c) Arrangement for feedback response from students, parents and other stakeholders on quality-related institutional processes;
- d) Dissemination of information on various quality parameters of higher education;
- e) Organization of inter and intra institutional workshops, seminars on quality related themes and promotion of quality circles;
- f) Documentation of the various programmes/activities leading to quality improvement;
- g) Acting as a nodal agency of the Institution for coordinating quality-related activities, including adoption and dissemination of best practices;
- h) Development and maintenance of institutional database through MIS for the purpose of maintaining /enhancing the institutional quality;
- i) Development of Quality Culture in the institution;
- j) Preparation of the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) as per guidelines and parameters of NAAC, to be submitted to NAAC.

Benefits

IQAC will facilitate / contribute

- a) Ensure heightened level of clarity and focus in institutional functioning towards quality enhancement;
- b) Ensure internalization of the quality culture;
- b) Ensure enhancement and coordination among various activities of the institution and institutionalize all good practices;
- c) Provide a sound basis for decision-making to improve institutional functioning;
- d) Act as a dynamic system for quality changes in HEIs;
- e) Build an organised methodology of documentation and internal communication.

Composition of the IQAC

IQAC may be constituted in every institution under the Chairmanship of the Head of the institution with heads of important academic and administrative units and a few teachers and a few distinguished educationists and representatives of local management and stakeholders.

The composition of the IQAC may be as follows:

1. Chairperson: Head of the Institution
2. A few senior administrative officers
3. Three to eight teachers
4. One member from the Management

5. One/two nominees from local society, Students and Alumni
6. One/two nominees from Employers /Industrialists/stakeholders
7. One of the senior teachers as the coordinator/Director of the IQAC

The composition of the IQAC will depend on the size and complexity of the institution. It helps the institutions in planning and monitoring. IQAC also gives stakeholders or beneficiaries a cross-sectional participation in the institution's quality enhancement activities. The guidelines given here are only indicative and will help the institutions for quality sustenance activities.

The membership of such nominated members shall be for a period of two years. The IQAC should meet at least once in every quarter. The quorum for the meeting shall be two-third of the total number of members. The agenda, minutes and Action Taken Reports are to be documented with official signatures and maintained electronically in a retrievable format.

It is necessary for the members of the IQAC to shoulder the responsibilities of generating and promoting awareness in the institution and to devote time for working out the procedural details. While selecting these members several precautions need to be taken. A few of them are listed below:

- ♦ It is advisable to choose persons from various backgrounds who have earned respect for integrity and excellence in their teaching and research. Moreover, they should be aware of the ground realities of the institutional environment. They should be known for their commitment to improving the quality of teaching and learning.
- ♦ It would be appropriate to choose as senior administrators, persons in charge of institutional services such as library, computer center, estate, student welfare, administration, academic tasks, examination and planning and development.
- ♦ The management representative should be a person who is aware of the institution's objectives, limitations and strengths and is committed to its improvement. The local society representatives should be of high social standing and should have made significant contributions to society and in particular to education.

The role of coordinator

The role of the coordinator of the IQAC is crucial in ensuring the effective functioning of all the members. The coordinator of the IQAC may be a senior person with expertise in quality aspects. She/he may be a full-time functionary or, to start with, she/he may be a senior academic /administrator entrusted with the IQAC as an additional responsibility. Secretarial assistance may be facilitated by the administration. It is preferable that the coordinator may have sound knowledge about the computer, its various functions and usage for effective communication.

Operational Features of the IQAC

Quality assurance is a by-product of ongoing efforts to define the objectives of an institution, to have a work plan to achieve them and to specify the checks and balances to evaluate the degree to which each of the tasks is fulfilled. Hence devotion and commitment to improvement rather than mere institutional control is the basis for devising procedures and instruments for assuring quality. The right balance between the health and growth of an institution needs to be struck. The IQAC has to ensure that whatever is done in the institution for "education" is done efficiently and effectively with high standards. In order

to do this, the IQAC will have to first establish procedures and modalities to collect data and information on various aspects of institutional functioning.

The coordinator of the IQAC and the secretary will have a major role in implementing these functions. The IQAC may derive major support from the already existing units and mechanisms that contribute to the functions listed above. The operational features and functions discussed so far are broad-based to facilitate institutions towards academic excellence and institutions may adapt them to their specific needs.

Monitoring Mechanism

The institutions need to submit yearly the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) to NAAC. A functional Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and timely submission of Annual Quality Assurance Reports (AQARs) are the Minimum Institutional Requirements (MIR) to volunteer for second, third or subsequent cycle's accreditation. During the institutional visit the NAAC peer teams will interact with the IQACs to know the progress, functioning as well quality sustenance initiatives undertaken by them.

The Annual Quality Assurance Reports (AQAR) may be the part of the Annual Report. The AQAR shall be approved by the statutory bodies of the HEIs (such as Syndicate, Governing Council/Board) for the follow up action for necessary quality enhancement measures.

The Higher Education Institutions (HEI) shall submit the AQAR regularly to NAAC. The IQACs may create its exclusive window on its institutional website and regularly upload/ report on its activities, as well as for hosting the AQAR.

The NAAC Accredited institutions need to submit only the soft copy as word file (.doc/.docx) through e-mail (naac.aqar@gmail.com). The file name needs to be submitted with Track ID of the institution and College Name. For example MHC0GN16601-Samudra Arts and Science College, Taliamegu-Maharashtra.doc or EC_32_A&A_143 dated 3-5-2004-Samudra Arts and Science College, Taliamegu-Maharashtra.doc. The Higher Education Institutions need not submit the printed/hard copy to NAAC. The acknowledgements would be sent to the institutions through e-mail.

The Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) of the IQAC

All NAAC accredited institutions will submit an annual self-reviewed progress report to NAAC, through its IQAC. The report is to detail the tangible results achieved in key areas, specifically identified by the institutional IQAC at the beginning of the academic year. The AQAR will detail the results of the perspective plan worked out by the IQAC. (Note: The AQAR period would be the Academic Year. For example, July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2013)

ANNEXURE- II
FEEDBACK ANALYSIS

Feedback is taken from all the stakeholders- students, parents, alumni, employers and teachers- annually and it is analyzed and appropriate action is taken. Two feedbacks are taken from the final year students, one on the teachers and the other on the institution, programme and curriculum. The feedback on the teachers is evaluated by the management and suggestions for improvements are given to the teachers concerned. The overall feedback on the institution, program and curriculum is maintained in the departments. The feedback is evaluated and necessary actions are taken by the Heads of the Departments. 58% of the students have marked that the institution, programs and curriculum is very effective. A feedback on the office and infrastructure is taken from the teachers. Parent, alumni and employer feedback are also taken annually. A number of suggestions were put forward by different stakeholders and based on the suggestions, the following actions were initiated

- Certificate and skill enhancement programs were introduced
- Career Oriented Courses were introduced
- Career Guidance Programs were organized
- Inter disciplinary, Research oriented programs were conducted
- Environment Conscientisation programs were organized

ANNEXURE III

Best Practice- I

1. Title of the Practice

Life Guidance Course

2. Goal

The objective of the course is to equip the students to take up the responsibilities of an adult in the family, society and the nation through a sociological and psychological approach

3. The Context

This course has been internalised by the institution and has been a best practice of the institution for more than 30 years. But in the midst of final year project and examination, it is very difficult to find time for this 3 day program

4. The Practice

Every year a 3 day Life Guidance Course is offered to final year undergraduate students of the college. As a college established in the pre-independent era with the objective of empowering Indian women, the college is very particular about imparting holistic education to the students. The basic unit of a society is the family and women have a very important role in the prosperity and development of a family. Hence it is very essential to give final year students, who will go out into the wide world after graduation, the basic facts of marital life and the crucial role of women in the character formation of the children of the family. As the proverb goes “When you educate a man you educate a single person but when you educate a woman you educate a whole society”. Eminent psychologists are invited to speak and interact with the students on marriage, man-woman relationship, marital problems and social and national responsibilities of an adult Indian citizen. Sex education is also an important part of the program.

5. Evidence of Success

The feedback from the students and the alumni point to the great success of the program.

Students have commended on the relevance of this course in their practical lives and alumni have many times come back to the alma mater to acknowledge with gratitude, the usefulness of this course in their married lives.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

A residential programme with good resource persons and innovative methods would enhance the effectiveness of the course. This involves the need for more financial support.

7. Notes

Life Guidance Course is a must in every institution as it is of great practical use in the personal life of the students.

Best Practices- II

1. Title of the Practice

St. Mary's Outreach Sponsorship Project

2. Goal

A project promoting partnership of educational institutions with the aim of uplifting the under privileged children of a locality through financial, educational, moral and cultural support and sponsorship.

3. The Context

Identifying the community and the children in need of educational sponsorship was a challenging issue. As the college is situated in the heart of Thrissur city, the localities nearby are usually urban and developed. Hence it was decided that the children of Nadathara Panchayath, which is a village already adopted by the college for social service activities can be taken as the target community. The college has a creche and tailoring unit already at the village for the benefit of the local community. Identification of the chosen 50 children was done through a socio economic survey conducted by NSS volunteers of the college at Nadathara.

4. The Practice

This is a collaborative venture between two educational institutions for the upliftment of unprivileged children of a local community. In 2003 an MOU was signed by the college with Rajagiri College of Social Science for a period of 8 years for the upliftment of 50 children in the 11th Ward of Nadathara, the adopted village of St. Mary's college, Thrissur. The project envisions not only financial assistance but also the development of a whole community through education. Hence awareness classes are conducted for the parents as well. Identification of the needy children was done through a socio-economic survey conducted by NSS volunteers of the college at Nadathara. Fifty children below the age of 12 were selected. The amount for the project is contributed by the departments in proportion to their student strength. At the beginning of every academic year study materials are distributed. Students are given awareness classes on study techniques, stress management etc. Students monitor the development of the children by regularly conducting parent's and children's meetings, tuitions, awareness classes on health and hygiene, adolescent problems, alcoholism, career guidance and leadership training. During the summer vacation a 3 day "Souhrdam Camp" is organized for the students. In 2012-13 the target group was the children of Myleepadam, Kundupara and Kovilakathu padam.

5. Problems Encountered And Resources Required

As the target community was around 10 k.m away from the college it was difficult for the staff and students to go to the place for the activities. So it is better to identify a target group near the college premises. Another problem was the lack of finance for the project. To really make a difference in the lives of these children is a huge financial commitment. The collection of such a huge amount of money is a problem and the college has to find a way to collect the same through the co-operation of all the departments.
