



Students Feedback on Curriculum (2023-2024)


Feedback was collected from UG and PG students, and consolidated separately by HODs. The consolidated feedbacks were analysed by IQAC using Likert Scale. The satisfaction index is classified into five heads 0-20, 20-40, 40-60, 60-80 and 80-100.

Number of students responded – UG - 613 PG - 213








Consolidated Report of College Council and IQAC

- To improve students' perception and learning abilities, it was suggested to integrate
 more ICT methods into the educational framework. Alongside the current ICT
 resources such as Google Classrooms, YouTube channels, online content, blogs,
 Slide Share, and podcasts, interactive boards have also been implemented.
- To address the requirements of slow learners, faculty members were encouraged to enhance the effectiveness and organization of remedial classes, classroom activities.
- Suggestions were given to boost collaborations between departments and industries for better learning experiences and job skills for students.
- Departments were encouraged to organize additional career-focused events and campus recruitments for their graduating students.
- Faculty members are advised to motivate both undergraduate (UG) and postgraduate (PG) students to engage in projects and internships beyond the prescribed curriculum.
 Additionally, there is a suggestion to encourage increased student participation in seminars, conferences, and workshops to enhance research aptitude.
- Departments are recommended to increase student engagement in online MOOC courses and familiarize students with electronic resources.
- Changes in Certificate and Skill courses were made based on student feedback.
 Department of BBA introduced a new certificate course on "Digital Marketing" for UG students. The department Commerce initiated a new skill course on "Digital Marketing" and a new certificate course on "Banking and Finance". The department of BSW introduced a new skill course on "Introduction to counselling skills".
- Department of Computer science initiated a new certificate course on "Personal Development Training" and Department of Botany introduced new skill and certificate course on "Cakes and Cookies" and "Nursery management and propagating techniques" respectively.



The results were discussed in IQAC meeting held on 14/06/2023 and were presented in the College Council meeting dated 19/07/2023.
