

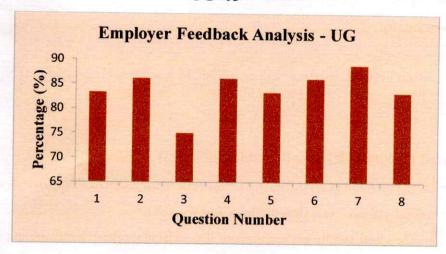
Employer Feedback on Curriculum 2023-24

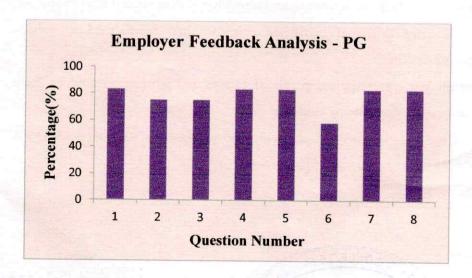

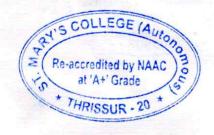
Respondent Group - Employers of UG and PG passed out students
